testamentary expenses are first paid and provided also that all household effects
shall be for the use of my wife during her life and I appoint my wife the said Alice

Miss Elizabeth Winifred Wilkin died of Eathorne, ^{Pennryn (!)} ~~Pennryn~~ Cornwall (spinster) died on 17th August 1912 at Mawman, Falmouth, Cornwall aged ^{intestate}. Admon of her estate granted at PPR on 12th September, 1912 to her father, Revd Samuel Rouse Wilkin

Mrs. Alice Annie Wilkin, nee Hall (2nd wife and widow of Revd Samuel Rouse Wilkin) of Edderscliffe, Balconal Road, ^{but formerly of Mabe, near Pennryn} Mawcannabe, Lancashire died on 11th March 1923 at 31, Anson Road, Rusholme, Manchester. Probate of her will was granted at Lancaster on 18th June 1923 to James Bernard Maltkin, automobile engineer, her nephew, of that address (Edderscliffe).

Miss Isabel Maud Wilkin, Alice's youngest step-child, is referred to in her (Alice's) will as [Mrs.] Isabel Maud Midlar [or Midlar] of Mabe, between Pennryn ^{as in the Probate} ~~(not Pennryn)~~ & Falmouth ^{the Probate} ~~Registrar~~. Midlar derives from a Scottish place-name in Aberdeenshire, I think!

(Douglas Bernard Hall once stood unsuccessfully as a Unionist candidate for the Parliamentary constituency of Pennryn and Falmouth, before winning the Isle of Wight seat in 1910.)
