THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT
of me EDWARD SMITH of 20 Wordsworth Avenue Cardiff in the County of Glamorgan ~
Wesleyan Minister I appoint Edmund Pearson of 235 Broad Street Pendleton Manchester ~
George Frederick Berry of Innellan Swinton Manchester and Hiram M. Binns of Bolton Road
Pendleton aforesaid (hereinafter called my Trustees) to be the EXECUTORS and Trustees of
this my will I bequeath the use and enjoyment of all my household furniture plate and
plated articles books pictures prints linen china glass and all my other household ef-
fects to my wife during her life And I declare that it shall not be necessary to take an
inventory thereof and that my trustees shall not be concerned to see to the insurance
thereof or be liable for any loss or damage that may happen thereto from any cause what-
soever And after the death of my said wife I give my said furniture and household goods
unto my son absolutely subject to his allowing each of my daughters to select such ar-
ticles therefrom as they may desire I bequeath to my said son my watch I devise. and ~

bequeath unto my trustees their heirs executors and administrators the residue of my estate and effects both real and personal whatsoever and wheresoever Upon trust to sell ~ call in and convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not already consist of money at such time or times and in such manner as they shall think fit and so that ~ they shall have the fullest power and discretion to postpone the sale calling in or conversion of the whole or any part or parts of my said real or personal estate during such period as they shall think proper without being responsible for loss but notwithstanding any such postponement of conversion of my real estate the same shall for the purpose of transmission be considered as converted from the time of my death And upon trust out of the proceeds of such sale calling in and conversion and out of my ready money to pay my funeral and testamentary expenses and debts And upon trust to invest the remainder of the said proceeds on good securities at a reasonable amount of interest and with power ^{for} my trustees from time to time to vary all or any of such investments and to stand ~ possessed of the investments for the time being constituting or representing my residuary estate In trust to pay the annual income thereof to my said wife during her life And ~ from and after her death to pay the said annual income thereof equally unto my two children Alice Dora and Harold Edward until the younger of them shall reach the age of twenty one years and after the younger of them shall have reached that age Upon trust for all my children in equal shares as tenants in common but in case my daughters Kate Shepherd and Elizabeth Hambleton are still unmarried disengaged and in fair health I direct my trustees to purchase annuities in the names of my trustees for them with their share of my said estate Provided always that if any child of mine shall die in my lifetime leaving a child or children who shall survive me and being a son or sons shall attain the age of twenty one years or being a daughter or daughters shall attain that age or marry under that age then and in every such case the last mentioned child or children shall take (and if more than one equally between them) the share which his or her parent would have ~ taken of and in my said estate if such parent had survived me And lastly I hereby revoke all former wills and testamentary dispositions heretofore made by me at any time and declare this to be my last will and testament IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand this Eighteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and one - EDWARD SMITH - Signed by the said testator Edward Smith as and for his last will in the presence of us present together at the same time who in his presence and in the presence of each other hereto subscribe our names as witnesses - W.E.CLOGG Solicitor Cardiff - -
