THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of me The Reverend ALEXANDER TITLEY HALL of Coombehurst Basingstoke in the County of Hants Clerk in Holy Orders Master of Arts I appoint The Public Trustee and my sister in law Dame Caroline Montgomery Hall and my nephew Sir Douglas Montgomery Bernard Hall Baronet (hereinafter called my trustees) to be the EXECUTORS and trustees of this my will It is my wish that my executors shall continue my establishment known as Coombehurst aforesaid for one month after the date of my funeral and that the said Dame Caroline Montgomery Hall and Sir Douglas Montgomery Bernard Hall shall have power if they so choose to reside at such house during such period as aforesaid for the purposes of the administration of my estate Also that during such period of one month from the date of my funeral my indoor servants shall be continued on board wages and my outdoor servants shall be continued at such wages as they are receiving at the date of my death such sums to be paid in addition to any sums then due I make the following specific bequests namely To my nephew the said Sir Douglas Montgomery Bernard Hall

the pair of Sheffield plate branch candlesticks left to me by Miss Elizabeth Margaret Calrow my oil painting of my father and the oil painting of a sleeping child painted by my late sister Margaret Bernardine Hall To my sister in law the said Dame Caroline Montgomery Hall all my books which shall be in my study or elsewhere at Coombehurst aforesaid (except such books as are hereinafter otherwise bequeathed) and also all my business and private papers also the painting in water colours of The Apothecary by W H Sullivan and the pair of Worcester china jugs painted with Swiss Scenes in the drawing room at Coombehurst aforesaid To Horace Stacey at present in my service my motor car with all accessories and also such of my outdoor effects including livestock garden and farm implements and fodder and such furniture personal effects and other contents of my house Coombehurst aforesaid as he may select except articles otherwise bequeathed by this my will to the value of five hundred pounds and the value of such indoor effects shall be taken according to the prices in the inventory and valuation made for me by Messieurs Simmons and Sons of Basingstoke in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifteen And the said Horace Stacey should he so desire is to have the use of the house he at present occupies the cow stable and piggeries at the rear and all the fields and farm buildings belonging to me and in my occupation at the time of my death together with the use of all roads giving access to them free of rent and rates and taxes for six months after the date of my death I bequeath to Nenone Innes Melville the widow of my late friend Doctor Gordon Moncreiff Melville now residing at Ashley Lodge Basingstoke Hampshire my study clock and the two framed etchings after Meissonier which are hung in the entrance Hall at Coombehurst aforesaid To her daughter Nenone Anna Melville my carriage clock with the alarm action and to her son James Elliott Moncreiff Melville the watch which my father gave me in commemoration of Queen Victoria's Jubilee together with the gold chain I usually wear my copy of the Encyclopaedia Britannica with index and any supplementary volumes and the leather pocket book which belonged to his father I give the following life annuities namely To Mrs Elizabeth Batley of Bergholt Acacia Avenue Shepperton Middlesex the widow of my cousin Richard Batley one hundred and four pounds To Annie Selina Smith and Annie Staines at present in my employment if in my service at the time of my death each an annuity of one hundred and four pounds but if they have left my service prior to the date of my death then I give to each of them an annuity of fifty two pounds in lieu of the said annuity of one hundred and four pounds To the said Horace Stacey an annuity of five hundred pounds and should he die before his wife Lilly Stacey an annuity of one hundred and fifty six pounds to be paid to her as from his decease In the event of the said Horace Stacey dying before me an annuity of one hundred and fifty six pounds to be paid to the said Lilly Stacey as from my decease in place of the last mentioned annuity To Miss Georgina Donnelly of No 125 Great Mersey Street Liverpool daughter of the late George Donnelly for many years keeper of Sandon Buildings Liverpool an annuity of twenty six pounds I direct that the said annuities be payable

Mission respectively I bequeath to the Public Trustee and the said Nenone Innes Mel-
ville (hereinafter called the special trustees) the sum of thirty thousand pounds to
be held by the special trustees upon the following trusts that is to say Upon trust
to invest the same and to pay one half of the income to arise from such investment
to the said Nenone Innes Melville for her life if and while she shall remain the widow
of the said Gordon Moncreiff Melville or in the event of her remarrying then in lieu
of such share and income Upon trust to pay her a life annuity of two hundred and fifty
pounds And subject as aforesaid I direct that my special trustees shall hold the said
sum of thirty thousand pounds and the investments from time to time representing the
same Upon trust for such of the said Nenone Anna Melville and James Elliott Moncreiff
Melville as shall attain the age of twenty five and if both attain that age in equal
shares absolutely but if either of them shall have died before attaining the age of
twenty five years leaving a child or children who live to attain the age of twenty
one years or being a daughter or daughters marry under that age then such child or
children shall take and if more than one equally between them the share the parent
would have taken on attaining the age of twenty five years And I direct that the
special trustees shall subject to such life interest or annuity as is payable to the
said Nenone Innes Melville apply the whole of the income derived from the respective
expectant shares of the said Nenone Anna Melville and James Elliott Moncreiff Melville
or their children in the said sum of thirty thousand pounds or the investments from
time to time representing the same for the maintenance education advancement and
benefit of the said Nenone Anna Melville and James Elliott Moncreiff Melville or their
children respectively until he or she or they respectively shall attain the age of
twenty five years or twenty one years or marry as the case may be or die under the
said respective ages and as to daughters without having been married I direct that all
the foregoing annuities and legacies whether specific or pecuniary be paid and carried
out free of all death duties whatsoever but limited to the duties payable on the occa-
sion of my death leaving duties payable on the occasion of subsequent deaths to be
borne by the respective funds concerned In the event of any sums of money lent by me
to friends or relations not having been repaid at the time of my death I direct that
all such debts shall be cancelled I give devise and bequeath all my real and personal

estate not hereby otherwise disposed of Upon trust after payment of my debts funeral and testamentary expenses legacies and annuities and the duties thereon together with the Public Trustees annual income fee on certain annuities to be provided for in manner hereinbefore mentioned in trust for the said Douglas Montgomery Bernard Hall absolutely Lastly I hereby revoke all former wills and testamentary dispositions made by me
