In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this third day of April One thousand eight hundred and sixty seven John Hambleton. Signed published and declared by the said John Hambleton as his last Will in the joint presence of us who in his presence at his request and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses
