I William Frederick Bickmore, Clerk in Holy Orders Vicar of Stone in the County of Worcester, revoke all former Wills & Codicils and declare this to be my last Will. I appoint my Sons Francis & Row Bickmore M. A. Clerk in Holy Orders and Arthur Lawrence Bickmore B. A. Executors & Trustees of this my Will. I bequeath to my three Daughters Theresa Gertrude Amelia Gertrude and Florence Ethel all my furniture and household effects wearing apparel horses carriages live & dead stock harness & stable furniture jewellery linen glass china books pictures, prints ornaments musical & other instruments plate & plated articles ~~wares~~ & household stores which shall be in Stone Vicarage at the time of my death with the exception of such articles as during my lifetime I have notified to each of my Children should be theirs after my death and have entered in writing in a certain Memorandum Book which will be found in the top drawer of the Bureau in my bedroom And I bequeath the Policy of Assurance on my life in the "Standard Life Assurance Company" for £1000 numbered 20365 and that in the "London Life Association" for £1000 numbered 9343 and that in the "British Medical & General Life Association Limited" for £500 numbered 1528 and that in the same Association for £500 numbered 19126 and I also bequeath all the residue of my personal estate whatsoever to my Trustees Upon Trust to call in collect or otherwise convert into money such parts of the same as shall not consist of money and out of these moneys thus collected and the ready money of which I shall be possessed at the time of my death to pay my funeral expenses and debts And to invest the residue of the said moneys in their names in any of the Public Stocks or funds or Government Securities of the United Kingdom or on the Mortgage of freehold, or leasehold property in England or Wales or on Debentures or preference Stock of any Company incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter carrying on business in the United Kingdom & paying Dividends on its ordinary shares, with power to vary the said securities at their discretion and to pay the Income of the said Trust monies and investments to such of my Daughters Theresa Gertrude, and Florence Ethel as shall be unmarried at the time of my death share and share alike On the Marriage of any or two of them I desire the income to be paid to them or her remaining unmarried and on the death of any one or two I desire the income to be paid to the survivor or survivors with power to leave the capital as the last survivor may think fit. 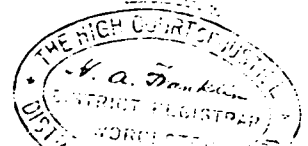
