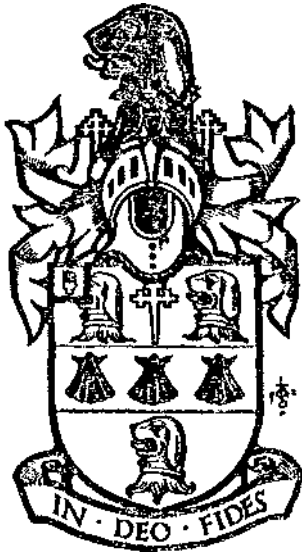

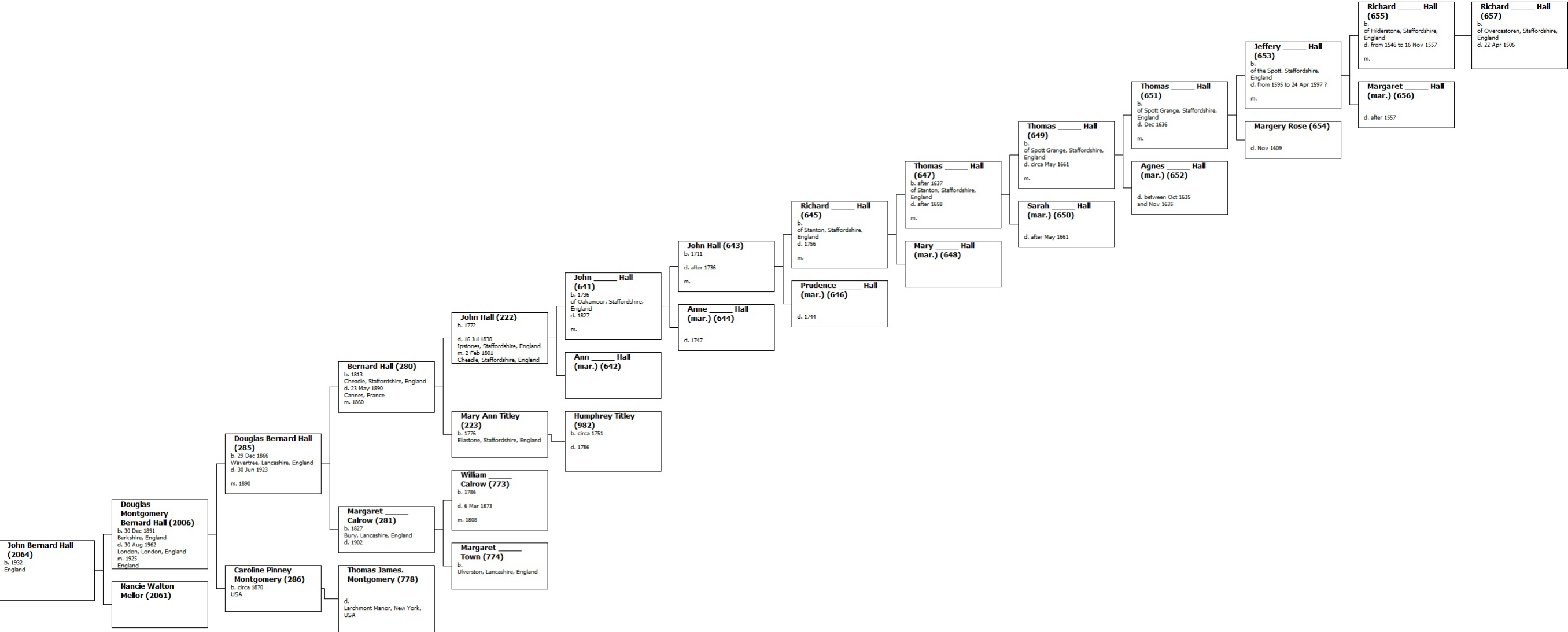

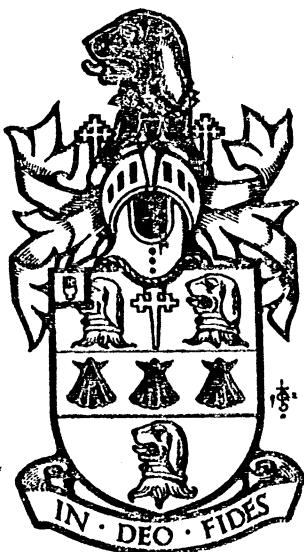

HALL OF DUNGLASS.



Sir Julian Henry Hall, 11th Bt., of Dunglass, co. Haddington, served in World War II 1939–45 with Intelligence Corps and Special Forces, editor of *Colour* 1931–32, Home Talks Dept. B.B.C. 1948–51, author of *Laura Seaborn*, *The Senior Commoner*, and *Two Exiles*, and various articles, b. 22 Feb. 1907, *educ.* Eton, and Balliol Coll. Oxford (Scholar, B.A.), s. his father 1958.

Lineage—ROBERT HALL, of Dunglass, m. Joanna, dau. of Andrew Wardlaw, of Torrie, and left a son and successor,

ROBERT HALL, m. Helen, dau. of David Crichton, of Longtowa, and was s. by his only son,
