This is the last Will and Testament of me Thomas Alexander Hall of the Cottage, Ipstones Staffordshire I direct that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses be paid by my Executors or hereinafter named as soon as conveniently can be after my decease. I leave and bequeath to my Wife Annie Hall the whole of the income proceeding from my Estate year after year for the term of her natural life. Likewise bequeath to my Wife Annie Hall for the term of her natural life the sole use of all my Household Furniture. I bequeath to my Daughter Alice Annie Hall the side Board and the best bed and to my Daughter Sarah Ellen Hall the Parure and next best Bed at the decease of my Wife Annie Hall the whole of my property real and personal shall be divided amongst my children each equal shares. Be it remembered that my son John Hall my son William Hall my Daughter Elizabeth Tatton and my son Thomas Alexander Hall have received one hundred pounds each towards their shares my son Rowland Hambleton Hall has received two hundred pounds towards his share my son Ralph Critchlow Hall has received the full amount of his share nevertheless he shall receive one hundred pounds more at the discretion of the Executors. I give my Executors a discretionary power to give to my other children one hundred pounds each on their attaining the age of twenty one years or to withhold it untill the death of my Wife. If any of my children die before this my will be fully executed leaving issue that issue shall receive their Father's or Mother's share not yet unreceived and I give my Executors a discretionary power to expend the interest or any part of the Legacy they may deem needfull for the maintenance and education of that issue And I hereby appoint my wife Annie Hall Executrix and my son John Hall my son William Hall and my son Thomas Alexander Hall my Executors. I declare this to be my last Will and Testament revoking all others. Signed this 12th day of June 1884

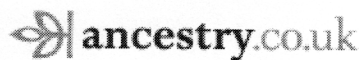
