DEATH OF MRS. ALLEN.—The remains of Mrs. Allen, wife of Mr. W. Allen, a former M.P. for Newcastle, were interred at St. Giles' Parish Church, Cheadle, on Saturday afternoon. The coffin was placed in the church early on Saturday morning, having previously been conveyed from Scotland, where Mrs. Allen had died on the 12th inst. following an operation. Mrs. Allen was a daughter of Mr. John Hall, Ball Haye Hall, Leek. A service was held in the Parish Church, the Rev. E. S. Carlos officiating. Mr. D. Lovatt presided at the organ, and a full choir was in attendance. The hymns "Lo, round the throne a glorious band" and "There is a land of pure delight" were beautifully sung. The coffin was of polished oak with brass fittings and bore the following inscription:—JEANNETTE Born 8th July, 1871; Died, 12th September, 1918." At the graveside the hymn, "Peace, perfect peace," was impressively sung by the choir and congregation. The following were the principal mourners:—Mr. W. Allen (husband), Mr. John Hall (father), Mr. Bernard Hall and Mr. George Hall (brothers), Miss Kate Hall (sister), and Mrs. Allen and Miss Allen (Woodhead Hall). There were also present Mr. and Mrs. R. Heywood (Hales Hall), Mr. and Mrs. Cull, Dr. and Mrs. Leapingwell, Mrs. J. R. B.
