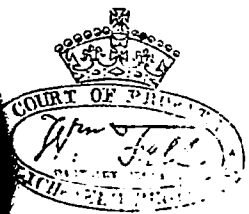

This is the last will and Testament of me George Locker
of The Oldridge in the parish of Kingsley in the County of Stafford
Executors I appoint my son John Bernard Locker and my nephew
Thomas Smith of Whiston Eaves Executors and Trustees of this my
will And I hereby give to them the sum of Two hundred and
fifty pounds Sterling clear of Legacy Duty In trust to invest the
same on Security And to pay the interest to my said son until
my Grandson James Keys shall attain his age of twenty one
years And then to pay the interest to my said Grandson until
he shall attain his age of Twenty four years And then to pay to
him the said Principal sum but in case he shall die before
he attains the age of twenty ^{four} ~~one~~ years without leaving any
lawful issue him surviving then I direct the same to fall
into the residue of my Estate for the benefit of my Residuary
Legatee but in case he shall so die leaving lawful issue him
surviving then I give the same to all his lawful issue or
children in equal shares with power to apply the interest in
their clothing maintenance and education during their Infancy
and with benefit of survivorship amongst them as to a
Original and accruing shares in case of any of their deaths
under the age of Twenty one years And subject to the
payments of the said Legacy and of all my just debts funeral
Probate and Testamentary expences I hereby give devise and
bequeath all my Farming Stock household goods and all my
Imprugages lands and hereditaments, (if any) and all other Real
and Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever that I may
leave at my death unto my said son John Bernard
Locker his heirs executors Administrators and assigns for
~~ever~~ for his and their own use and benefit And I hereby
revoke all former Wills by me made and do declare this
to be my last will In witness whereof I have hereunto
subscribed my name this thirty first day of May in the
year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty
nine. George Locker - Signed by the said George Locker
the Testator as and for his last will and Testament in the
presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of



each other have subscribed our names as witnesses being both present together at one and the same time during such signing and subscribing John Hall - Harriot Flower
