Richard Hall (657) of Overcastoren in the parish of Ilam in the County of Stafford was the owner of considerable land in this parish in the reign of Edward IV in 1474 as set forth in the Inquisition Post Mortem taken at his death at Wolverhampton on Sept. 18th 1536 in the 28th year of Henry VIII reign.

He left five sons [**Richard (655)**, **Thomas (660)**, **William (661)**, **John (658)**, **Sir Humphrey (659)**], and his youngest son **Richard Hall (655)** of Hilderstone in the parish of Stone, County of Stafford died 1557 and left by Margaret (656) his wife two sons [**Jeffery (653)**, **Thomas (662)**] and two daughters [**Elizabeth (663)**, **Joane (664)**]; the eldest of these was **Jeffery (653)** of Spott Grange in the parish of Stone, died 1597 and left by Margery (654) his wife two sons [**Thomas (651)**, **Sampson (665)**] and four daughters [**Agnes (663)**, **Elizabeth (667)**, **Ann (668)**, **???**].

The eldest of these sons **Thomas Hall (651)** of Spott Grange died 1636 and left by Agnes (652) his wife one son [**Thomas (649)**] and four daughters [**???** (670), **Joan (671)**, **Ellen (672)**, **Margaret (669)**].

This son **Thomas (649)** of Spott Grange added considerably to his landed property by the purchase of the Blackhill Estate from the Povey family and other land in the parish of Hilderstone as set forth in his will dated April 1st 1658.

He died in 1661 and left by Sarah (650) his wife three sons [**Thomas (647)**, **John (673)**, **William (674)**] and two daughters [**Margaret (676)**, **Mary (675)**].

The second of these sons **Thomas Hall (647)** of Stanton, in the parish of Ellastone in the county of Stafford left by Mary (648) his wife three sons [**Thomas (677)**, **Richard (645)**, **William (678)**].

The youngest of these **Richard Hall (645)** of Stanton died at Ellastone in 1756 and had issue by Prudence **(646)** his wife two sons the eldest **[John (843)]** died in infancy and **John (643)** the other son who was born in 1710 died leaving by Anne **(644)** his wife an only son also called **John (641)** of Oakamoor in the County of Stafford who was born 1736 and died 1827.

He left by Ann **(642)** his wife one son **[John (222)]** and three daughters **[Mary (679), Ann (680), Elizabeth (681)]**; this son **John Hall (222)** of Cheadle in the County of Stafford married Mary Titley **(223)** of Stanton and died 1838 leaving issue two sons **[four sons - John (226), Thomas Alexander (175), Edward (976), Bernard (280) and three daughters - Elizabeth (225), Mary Anne (224), Sarah (974)]**; the younger **Bernard Hall (280)** who died 1890, sometime an Ensign and Lieut. of the Kingston Regt. of Foot (Commission date 1840) married 1st 1843 his cousin Mary **[Mary Ann (279)]** daughter of William Titley **(777)**, and had issue by her three sons **[William Titley (761), Bernard Vincent (762), Alexander Titley (287)]** and one daughter **[Emilia (763)]** all unmarried and who are all dead except Alexander Titley Hall **(287)** the 3rd son Clerk in Holy Orders, M.A. of Oxford, for many years vicar of Appleby County Lincoln who still survives also unmarried. After her death in 1857 he married 2nd in 1860 Margaret **(281)** 5th daughter of William Calrow **(773)** of Walton Lodge, Walton-le-Dale County Lancaster J.P.D.L. for that county and had issue by her who died in 1902 two sons **[Percy Bernard (764), Douglas Bernard (285)]** and four daughters **[Margaret Bernadine (766), Florence Bernadine (768), Evelyne Bernard (770), Muriel Bernard (769)]** who are all dead with the exception of the youngest son **Douglas Bernard Hall (285)** of Burton Park in the County of Sussex, J.P. for that county and Lord of the manors of Burton and Crouch, Patron of the Livings of Barlavington, Burton and Coates. M.P. for the Isle-of-Wright since 1910. Who was born in 1866 and married in 1890 Caroline **(286)** only daughter of Thomas James Montgomery **(778)** of Larchmont Manor New York State U.S.A. and has issue one child a son **Douglas Montgomery Bernard Hall (2006)** who was born 1891 and is now (1913) 2nd Lieut. in the 3rd Coldstream Guards
